

Planning makes it easy to learn...

The Central Florida Chapter is proud to announce that **Lanny Wood** (pictured below and with his class), from Timber Creek High School, as the 2013 Central Florida Chapter Teacher of the Year (TOY).

The CFC selection Committee found many deserving teachers. Each with unique skills that help our students.

With a career of excellence, Lanny Wood practiced architecture for over 20 years with large

multinational firms in Minneapolis, Washington, DC and Chicago.

With this experience, he fulfilled a dream to help students in the class-room. Soon after, he took the plunge, landing at Glenridge Middle School in Orlando teaching 7th grade math. His students quickly responded to his real world experience and application of math principles through projects

that applied to design of real world things, planning cost estimates, etc. This intentional "real world" focus and application really connected with the students.

Soon Lanny was asked to take over the Drafting Curriculum at Timber Creek High

School. As an architect, it was easy for him to bring his background, experience, and project based learning to the Drafting Room. With his curriculum change in 2009/2010, Timber Creek's Drafting III class participated in the national pilot of an online high school architectural design curriculum, now known as

Upon return, and with little lead time, Lanny quickly adapted the existing Timber Creek drafting studio to accommodate PLTW's Introduction to Engineering Design course. After presenting the planned curriculum to students and their parents at Timberlakes's freshman orientation, he launched the program. A small start grew quickly to five sections of Introduction to Engineering Design at the start of the school year.
