Now growing in size and interest, CyberPatriot V is open to all high schools, Civil Air Patrol Units, JROTC Units, US Naval Sea Cadet Corps Units, and accredited home school programs around the country.

Sailplanes to Spacecraft

Four Chapter members, Stan and Mary McNatt, along with Barbara Walters-Phillips and her husband, Pat, participated in the annual summer Aerospace Education Workshop which was jointly sponsored by the Montgomery Air Force Association Chapter 102 and the Civil Air Patrol. Barbara, who has attended before and is also the Sun n Fun Aerospace Educator Teacher's Workshop Chairman, was instrumental in some of the planning and coordination of the workshop. The Chapter is looking into possibly increasing our participation next summer and hoping to send some local teachers.

We were excited to join the other 40+ participants. The trip began on a Maxwell 908th Airlift Wing C-130 to Edwards AFB, CA. As neither of us has served in the military, this was the first time that we had been on a C-130 and we loved it – despite all the warnings that we were given about it being a long, noisy flight. Being able to land at Edwards AFB and take a tour of the flight line was one of the highlights of our trip, so we were already off to a great start! In addition to the tour of the flight line, we toured the Global Hawk Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) facility and the NASA/Dryden Flight Research Center's SOFIA airplane. It is one thing to read about the work that is done in these facilities, or even watch documentaries about them, but to see them firsthand is an unbelievable experience. We also had the opportunity to fly in an F-18 flight simulator. This is similar to ones that are currently used to train new and current pilots that are serving in our armed services today. It gave us a new sense of appreciation for the pilots that serve in our armed forces based on the complexity and skill that is involved.

At the Mojave Air and Space Port, we were able to visit The Spaceship Company including the FAITH Hanger, where the Spaceship 2 was being docked to WhiteKnight 2.

We visited the Tehachapi Wind Turbine Farm and the Terra-Gen Power Center and learned about geothermal, wind and solar energy. The tour included going to the top of a mountain and looking out over the thousands of wind turbines that cover the landscape for as far as your eyes can see. It was one of those experiences that is hard to put into words. It is also worth mentioning that we could see Edwards AFB as well.

At the Yanks Air Museum, we were given a tour of the museum. This offered a wide collection of

airplanes and gave all attendees the opportunity to learn the history of aircraft from years past.

One of the highlights of this trip was the visit to the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, which included a tour and presentation at the von Karman Museum, the Space Flight Operations Facility, and the Mars Yard, where the Mars Science Laboratory rover is tested. It gave us the opportunity to meet with several of the scientists and engineers that worked on the project and ask questions. They were able to provide us details on what strengths were needed (i.e. math, science and engineering) and how they used these different skills in their different areas of expertise. We did not expect to see the Mars Rover out in the yard when we arrived – and being able to see and hear the rover as it moved across the yard was an unbelievable experience. We learned afterwards that not even JPL employees are able to see this unless they have special permission. With the Curiosity Rover Landing on Mars (by the time you read this it will have already taken place) being so close, it has given us a personal perspective of the landing that we never would have had without this workshop.

The final day of the trip was spent at the Southern California Soaring Academy where we participated in a glider flight. This was an awesome experience. It put you right in the front seat, with the pilot in the back. The sound of the tow plane was heard as you were taken to the sky, and then once the tow line was dropped, the silence was deafening as you soared 7,000 to over 10,000 feet. For many of us, this was our first time riding in a glider and it will not be our last!

This was our first excursion of this nature, and we anticipate attending future workshops. Being able to see firsthand some of the opportunities and programs being offered to teachers that they can relate back to their students was very rewarding. And, being able to experience things that we never thought were possible made this an incredibly gratifying experience.


